I have been honored to lead the beloved Summit Choral Society (SCS) since 2017 as the Executive Artistic Director and incredibly grateful to be part of the Akron community. Our nationally recognized, award-winning programs serve all ages with opportunities to learn and grow in multiple facets of music, from singing and theory, exciting musical games and composing to playing percussion. The Children's Choir Program serves children in grades K-12 with music education and performance opportunities. Youth in the Children's Choir Program averaged twenty-five weekly rehearsals and numerous performances, including singing at the historic and the newly renovated Goodyear Theater, St. Bernard Catholic Church and hosting Sing Invitational at Summit Artspace this past season. 
